600 Practices will run 1st followed by separate 200-yard practices

Open To: All Safe Shooters - NFGA Members and Non NFGA Members

600 Yard Practices:

April and October - Firing Starts at 10am and ends by 11:30

May through September - Firing Starts at 9am and ends by 10:30

Squadding closes 15 Minutes prior to listed start times (squad @ 600)

Fees: \$5 per shooter for 1 rifle firing 20 to 30ish rounds.

\$10 if shooting more than 1 rifle or more rounds desired to be fired. Time permitting.

200 Yard Practices:

April and October - Firing Starts approx. 11:45am and ends by 2PM

May through September - Firing Starts approx. 10:45am and ends by 1PM

Squad in pits as soon as the line is declared safe from 600 practice

Once we leave the pits to head to 200 squadding is closed.

Shooters Choice: Mix - Standing / Sitting / Prone - Slow and Timed Rapid Fire

Bipod and bag shooters welcome and encouraged

Fees: \$5 per shooter

As always - Strict Muzzle Down when closing bolts on a live round applies

Shooters are expected to bring quality rifles / ammo and known zeros

Anyone not on paper after 5 shots will stop firing – No Refunds

Ask RSO for help before this happens

These are not clinics – Shooters should have skills required to be safe

Coaching is welcome if you arrange for an experienced coach to help you

Typical You Shoot it - You Buy it Policy Applies to All

Sensors \$50 each / Sensor Wires \$20 each

Payment Due Day of Damages – No Return to Leveridge until Paid in Full

Having known zero's and due diligence keeps this a non-issue
